Do you think you could you fly a Radio Controlled model?

A "Fly and Try" voucher from The Royal County Aeromodellers' Club for only €25, buys 30 minutes flying the Club's Trainer with the full assistance of one of the Club's instructors. The voucher price can be redeemed against club fees should the user decide to become a member.

Novice members receive advice and guidance on the correct selection and set up of their model and equipment and will be taught to fly competently and safely by an assigned instructor. All training costs are included in the Club Fees.

What Does It Cost??

A beginner usually starts with a training package which consists of a ready to fly trainer style model, either petrol or electric powered, radio control equipment, fuel and all the associated items necessary to start flying. We would be most happy to advise you on all of these. The costs compare favourably with other sports and will depend on the level of equipment which must be purchased.

Once the model has been assembled the beginner should bring it out to the club field where an experienced member will check that everything is in order and take the model for a test flight. An instructor will then teach the beginner the basics of flying.

It is easy nowadays to start flying with an electric powered plane if one does not want to get into petrol engine models. There is some small saving to be had and the style of flying is slightly slower and more suitable for the beginner.
